

Health & Safety Policy Statement

Prestige Fire Safety Limited are committed to achieving, maintaining and improving a culture of health and safety best practice in all aspects of our operations, thereby ensuring that the highest standard of H&S management is present at all times. - Control of situations likely to cause injury or damage to property and/or equipment.

Prestige Fire Safety Limited accepts that it is their duty to ensure that everything reasonably practicable is done to safeguard employees and members of the public from personal injury in all work activities and to maintain a safe and healthy workplace.

Responsibilities

To ensure the prevention of ill health, the avoidance of accidents and the promotion of safe and healthy workplaces, the following responsibilities have been established.

Directors

The director, Paul Skinner has established the overall Health & Safety Policy and has responsibility for implementing and monitoring the policy.

The Director is responsible for:

- Keeping the Health & Safety Policy under review and ensuring that it is revised as and when necessary.
- Monitoring the policy's implementation and setting targets or objectives where appropriate.
- Bringing to the attention any faults or areas of weakness in the policy or its implementation to all employees.
- Ensuring that the relevant resources are made available to enable the policy to be implemented.



It is also the duty of all employees to act reasonably and do everything they can to prevent injury to themselves, their fellow workers and members of the public.

Our policy will be delivered by:

- Generating a culture that does not tolerate threats to health and safety.
- Ensuring the real involvement of all employees, sub-contractors and stakeholders.
